# Dunn-Landry Family Papers

## Biographical Notes

Pierre Landry (1841-1921) was born on a plantation owned by the Prevost family. The Prevost plantation was located in Ascension Parish. Ascension Parish had one of the largest slave populations in Louisiana and revolved around the sugar industry. Pierre was the son of a white plantation laborer Roseman Landry and Marcelite (Prevost) Landry a slave and cook on the Prevost plantation. He had two younger siblings Antoinette and Julian.

In 1854 Landry was sold in a public auction to the Bringier family. This family was very prominent in Louisiana during the antebellum period. They owned 35,000 acres of land in several Louisiana parishes. Landry was educated on the Bringier plantation in their primary and technical schools. He also received private instruction from Reverend W.D. Goodman and Reverend A.L Atkinson during this time period.

In 1866 Pierre Landry moved his family to the town of Donaldsonville, Louisiana, which had the third largest black community in the state. Within his first year of living in Donaldsonville he founded two black schools, constructed a house for his family and conducted a prosperous business. He was a very influential leader in the black community as well as in Ascension Parish. He was a leader of the Republican Party and served the community in various roles such as a lawyer, architect, judge superintendent of schools, juror, tax collector, president of police jury, parish school board, postmaster and justice of the peace.

In 1868 he was elected mayor of Donaldsonville and served for a one-year term. Landry was the first African American to hold a mayoral position in the United States. That same year Landry formed a self proclaimed faction of the black Republicans Party in Ascension Parish. He established this faction of the Republican Party in response to white carpetbaggers from northern states.

In 1872, Landry ran for a seat in the House of Representatives. With the help of blacks and a significant number of white voters he won the election by a landslide. During his term in the House he created numerous bills in support of the African Americans, one of his more important victories came when his bill passed to establish New Orleans University which became the third black private college in Louisiana.

In 1874 he was elected state senator where he served until 1880. In his term as a senator he was one of two black members to dine with President Ulysses S. Grant in 1875. Landry also served on the Ascension Parish School Board, served as a member of the police jury and edited a Christian paper the *Monthly Report* during his term as a senator.

Pierre Landry began gradually relinquishing his control over the Republican Party and increased his duties in the Methodist Church. He helped to rebuild St. Paul Methodist Episcopal Church in Donaldsonville, after it was destroyed by fire and he would eventually become the pastor of St. Paul's. He was elected presiding elder of the Baton Rouge District in 1881. Landry was then elected presiding elder of the Shreveport District in 1885 and in 1889 he became pastor of St Paul's Church in Shreveport. At the annual Methodist Episcopal conference in 1891 he was elected to the highest position in the Methodist Episcopal Church .The position was that of Presiding Elder of the South New Orleans District where he moved his family.

Pierre Landry also served as a principal and dean of several high schools. In 1900 Pierre was hired as the principal of Gilbert Academy in Baldwin, Louisiana. He served as dean and principal from 1900-1905. Gilbert Academy was a nationally recognized school that had its beginnings in 1865 as an agricultural and industrial college for recently emancipated Blacks. The college had been under the administration of the Methodist Episcopal Church. In 1919 the school merged with New Orleans University and was given the name Gilbert Academy High School. In 1930 when New Orleans University merged with Dillard University, Gilbert Academy inherited the whole building on St. Charles Avenue. In 1949 Gilbert Academy closed it's doors because a lack of funding from the Methodist Episcopal Church.

Pierre Landry had fourteen children. He had twelve children with his first wife Amanda Grigsby and two by his second wife Florence Simpkins.

Henderson Hollowell Dunn (1872-1955) was born in Thibodaux, Louisiana on December 12, 1872. His parents were Enoch an ex-slave and Ellen Dunn. Henderson received his early education at the first school for blacks in Lafourche Parish .The school was organized by his father Enoch Dunn who was the first teacher in Lafourche Parish.

Henderson H. Dunn went on to receive his Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1900 and Bachelor of Divinity in 1904, from Straight University. He did further study in education and theology at the University of Chicago. Following his graduation from Straight University, Reverend Dunn taught school and became pastor of Morris Brown Congregational Church in New Orleans. During the years of 1906-1921 he served as pastor of Central Congregational Church in New Orleans. He started many programs to enrich the lives of African Americans in New Orleans. One such program was the first day nursery for African Americans. The nursery was the Isabella Hume Child Development Center named in the memory of Isabella Hume. Isabella Hume had moved to New Orleans from New England in 1890 and served as assistant pastor to Reverend John Whittaker at Central Church from 1892 to 1896. Her leadership marked a enormous commencement of social service among blacks in New Orleans.

In 1924 Henderson H. Dunn resigned as pastor of Central Congregational Church to become regional secretary of the Congregational Churches in Arkansas, Louisiana Mississippi, Oklahoma and Texas. Dunn was an employee of the American Missionary

Association. As regional secretary he founded and organized the Colored Education Alliance an organization dedicated to obtaining a expanded number of schools for black communities. Reverend Dunn also began a long successful career as a teacher at Milne Boys Home. At Milne Boys Home Rev Dunn served as Director of the Summer Normal School where he trained New Orleans public school teachers. Also as director he supervised competitive examinations that determined the appointment of qualified persons to teaching position in New Orleans Public School System. In 1950 he retired from teaching.

Dunn was a news writer for the Times- Picayune newspaper where he wrote about African American religious and educational news. Many credit him as the first African American who wrote for the Times- Picayune. While at the Times-Picayune he was the director and an ardent worker of the Times- Picayune Doll and Toy Fund. The fund was established to help those who were unfortunate, giving them toys, clothes and other useful items during the Christmas season.

Each year from 1911 until his death in 1955 he appeared at the Annual Thanksgiving address. This address was given at the meeting of the Louisiana Educational Alliance where he would document the progress of the Negro in the United States along religious, educational and economic lines. Three years after his death New Orleans Public School System honored Henderson H. Dunn by dedicating a elementary school in his name.

Lillian Burdette Landry was born February 26,1888 in Donaldsonville, Louisiana. She was the daughter of the second marriage of Pierre Landry and Florence Simpkins. In 1895 the family moved to New Orleans when her father became presiding elder of the New Orleans District. In 1900-1905 when Pierre Landry became dean of Gilbert Academy in Baldwin, Florence Landry served as director of dorm life and homemaking until her death in 1905. Lillian also completed high school at Gilbert Academy in 1905 and went on to Wiley College in Marshall, Texas where she completed the Teachers Normal Course and Music in 1906. She became a member of the faculty at Wiley College where she taught until 1909. She then became a teacher at Haydel Private School in Wallace, Louisiana.

In 1910 Lillian was asked by her father to read his annual report to the Methodist Conference. It was here where she met Reverend Henderson H. Dunn her future husband of forty- five years. They were married December 28,1910. Reverend Dunn was pastor of Central Congregational Church in New Orleans, Louisiana. Lillian soon joined Central Congregational in March 1911. She served the church as an organist, solo singer in the choir and as the choir director in 1926. Mrs. Dunn also spent her time performing community service in the New Orleans area. She served as treasurer of the Women's Auxiliary of Flint Goodridge Hospital Ebony Fashion Fair and B-Sharp Music Club where she served as treasurer for forty- three years.

Reverend and Mrs. Dunn had five daughters, Beatrice Ellen Dunn Wilson was a graduate of Straight University and the first black assistant supervisor of visiting teachers in New Orleans Public Schools. She also served as a president of the Women's Auxiliary of Flint

Goodridge Hospital where she instituted the Miss Lady Fair Contest. Lillian Dunn Perry was the only black music consultant in New Orleans Public Schools. Florence Annie Dunn Swann was a graduate of Straight University, a kindergarten teacher and assistant minister of music at Central Church. Eloise Jocelyn Dunn Warrick was a graduate Gilbert Academy and Spelman College and a concert artist and music teacher in Gary Public Schools. Elise Dunn Cain is a graduate of Gilbert Academy and Spelman College. She is a retired New Orleans Public School teacher and one of the first to integrate a faculty in the elementary schools in New Orleans. Elise served as a Director of Volunteer Services at Flint Goodrige Hospital.

- 1841 Pierre Landry was born in Ascension Parish, Louisiana on a plantation owned by the Prevost family. Landry parents were Roseman Landry and Marcelite (Prevost) Landry.
- 1854 Pierre Landry was sold in a public auction to the Bringier family.
- 1866 Pierre Landry moved his family Donaldsonville, Louisiana.
- 1867 Pierre Landry founded two black schools, started a successful business and married Amanda Grigsby.
- 1868 Pierre Landry elected mayor of Donaldsonville serving a one-year term.
- 1872 Pierre Landry elected to the House of Representatives where he created a bill to establish New Orleans University.
- 1872 Henderson H. Dunn born in Thibodaux, Louisiana. His parents were Ellen and Enoch Dunn.
- 1874 Pierre Landry elected State Senator, he also served on the Ascension School Board and edited the *Monthly Record* a Christian Newspaper.
- 1881 Pierre Landry elected presiding elder of the Baton Rouge district of the Methodist Episcopal Church.
- 1885 Pierre Landry elected presiding elder of the Shreveport district of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Landry also became the pastor of St. Paul's Church in Shreveport.
- 1886 Pierre Landry married Florence Simpkins.
- 1888 Lillian Dunn born February 26<sup>th</sup> in Donaldsonville, Louisiana to Pierre Landry and Florence Simpkins.
- 1891 Pierre Landry elected presiding elder of New Orleans district of the Methodist Episcopal Church.
- 1900 Pierre Landry became dean of Gilbert Academy in Baldwin, Louisiana..

- 1900 Henderson H. Dunn graduated from Straight College with a Bachelor of Arts degree.
- 1904 Henderson H. Dunn received a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Straight College and began his service as pastor of Morris Brown Congregational Church in New Orleans, Louisiana.
- 1905 Pierre Landry's second wife Florence Simpkins died.  
Lillian Dunn graduated from Gilbert Academy.
- 1906 Lillian completed the Teachers Normal Course and Music program at Wiley College. Lillian also became a member of the Wiley College faculty. Henderson H. Dunn became pastor of Central Congregational Church in New Orleans, La.
- 1909 Lillian hired as a teacher at Haydel Private School in Wallace, Louisiana.
- 1910 Lillian was asked to read the annual report to the Methodist Conference by her father. Lillian met her future husband Henderson H. Dunn at the Methodist Conference. Lillian Landry and Henderson H. Dunn married on December 28.
- 1911 Henderson H. Dunn first appeared at the Annual Thanksgiving address. Lillian joined Central Congregational Church and eventually becoming the church choir director.
- 1912 Beatrice Ellen Dunn, born March 2, in New Orleans, La.
- 1914 Lillian Velma Dunn born October 24 in New Orleans La.
- 1918 Florence Annie Dunn born February 26 in New Orleans La.
- 1921 Henderson H. Dunn resigned as Pastor of Central Congregational Church in New Orleans, La
- 1924 Henderson H. Dunn became regional secretary of the Congregational Churches in Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma and Texas.
- 1929 Henderson H. Dunn hired as the Director of the Summer Normal School at Valena C. Jones School. Eloise and Elise Dunn, born January 30<sup>th</sup> in New Orleans, La.
- 1955 Henderson H. Dunn died.
- 1958 Dedication of Henderson Hollowell Dunn Elementary School in New Orleans, La.

- 1968 Florence Annie Dunn Swan died August 19 in New Orleans, La.
- 1970 Beatrice Ellen Dunn Wilson died October 4 in New Orleans, La.
- 1983 Lillian Landry Dunn died May 23 in New Orleans, La.
- 2000 Eloise Dunn Warrick died November 18 in New Orleans, La.
- 2002 Lillian Dunn Perry died November 23 in New Orleans, La.

Scope and Content Note

The Dunn-Landry Family Papers are comprised of correspondence, biographical information, newspaper articles, financial records, organizational minute books and ledgers, programs, scrapbooks, speeches, organizational reports, memorabilia and photographs created and collected by the various family members spanning the years 1872 to 2003. These materials reflect and document the leadership of a prominent Louisiana Creole family involved in local and national civil rights and community issues.

The papers have been arranged into nine series of personal and professional materials. The main bulk of the collection was created by Reverend Henderson H. Dunn, Lillian B. Landry and their daughter Elise Dunn Cain. Papers from other family members including Pierre Landry can be found throughout the collection. The series are arranged as follows: Correspondence, Memorabilia and Personal Papers (1898-2002, n.d.); Congregational Church and United Church of Christ Conference Material (1917-1997, n.d.); Central Congregational United Church of Christ and Other Institutional Papers (1916-1998, n.d.); Professional Papers (1872-1995, n.d.); Financial Records (1908-1992, n.d.); Publications & Collected Items (1900-2003, n.d.); Newspaper Clippings (1910-2002, n.d.); Photographs (1886-1999, n.d.) and Oversize Materials (1900-1999, n.d.).

Series I: Correspondence, Memorabilia & Personal Papers (1898-2002, n.d.) boxes 1-4 provides biographical information about the family members. This series of papers has been divided into alphabetical groupings by provenance (family member name) with file units in general alphabetical order by title. The papers of Mrs. Elise Dunn Cain, in this series, consist of memorabilia from Gilbert Academy and Spelman College alumni associations, including reports and event programs. Reverend Henderson H. Dunn and Mrs. Lillian Burdette Landry Dunn's personal papers include correspondence and memorabilia dating from 1901. Lillian B. Dunn's school papers from Gilbert Academy, post cards from her time at Wiley College can be found in box 3 of this series. Biographical information is available for Rev. Dunn as well as certificates, personal notes, and programs.

Series II: Congregational Church & United Church of Christ Conference Material (1917-1997, n.d.) consists of collected congregational and United Church of Christ minutes and programs from the religious conventions and conferences, which Reverend Henderson Dunn, Mrs. Lillian B. Dunn and other family members participated in and attended. The file units consist of programs, newsletters, minutes, reports and committee minutes arranged in alphabetical order by the title of the conference or convention. These files can be found in box 5 of the shelf listing. The conferences and convention materials include the Convention of the South, the Louisiana Congregational Conference from the late

1920s to the yearly 1930s, including material from 1947, the Plymouth Conference of the Southwest of the UCC annual meeting programs 1948-1962, and the South Central Conference of the UCC annual reports and minutes 1963-1968.

Series III: Central Congregational Church United Church of Christ and Other Institutional Papers (1916-1998) boxes 6-8 consists of minutes from board, committee and annual meetings, correspondence, reports and programs from Central Congregational UCC in New Orleans from 1916 to 1998. The files in this series were collected by Reverend Henderson Dunn, Lillian B. Dunn, Mrs. Elise Dunn Cain and other family members who were active church and board members. Reverend Dunn served as pastor for Central Congregational from 1904-1924. The arrangement of this series is alphabetical by document type or meeting name and within these groupings chronologically by date. Three other institutional files are included with this series, the Amistad Research Center correspondence file, which documents the donation of the Dunn-Landry Family papers to the Amistad Research Center, a correspondence file for the Women's Auxiliary to Flint-Goodridge Hospital Ebony Fashion Fair and minutes for the Women's Missionary Union and the State Extension Committee from the 1920s. These hand-script minute booklets were done in pencil and ink and were kept by Mrs. Lillian B. Dunn who was a member of these committees.

Series IV: Professional Papers (1872-1995, n.d.) the papers in box 9 consists of correspondence, journals, sermon notes and programs created or collected by family members in the course of their professional work. The bulk of the materials were generated by Reverend Henderson Dunn during his work as pastor of Central Congregational Church and Pierre Landry's work as the pastor of the St. Paul Methodist Episcopal Church in Donaldsonville, LA, and as Principal of Brian Public School and Gilbert Academy. Also, included is correspondence with the Orphans Home Board from 1910-1919 and his affiliation with the Republican Party in 1872. The papers are arranged alphabetically by provenance (family member name) and by organization, with file units in general chronological order.

Series V: Financial Records (1908-1992, n.d.) boxes 10-12 contain personal and organizational financial records. The bulk of the materials relating to the Women's Auxiliary of Flint Goodridge Hospital dating 1964-1974 can be found in this series. Other organizations include the B-Sharp Music Club, Central Congregational Church, Convention of the South and the Plymouth Conference of the Southwest. The file units are arranged alphabetically by organizational name and by document type. Personal financial records for Lillian B. Dunn, Reverend Henderson Dunn and Florence Landry and Beatrice Wilson are included in box 10 alphabetically by provenance with papers in chronological order within the file units. This series includes checks, receipts, treasure's reports, account books, budgets, invoices, and Ebony Fashion Fair reports.

Series VI: Publications & Collected Items (1900-2003, n.d.) boxes 13-16 contain publications and memorabilia including news clippings, books, invitations, pamphlets, magazines and booklets with programs as the bulk of this part of the collection. The collection is arranged alphabetically by document type with file units in alphabetical order by title and then chronologically. The materials within this series consist of many Congregational Church and United Church of Christ publications. Also included are programs for musical concerts including the New Orleans Black Chorale Annual Black History Program from 1983-1993, B-Sharp Music Club, and the New Orleans Philharmonic Symphony. Publications are grouped in box 16 and consist of multiple subjects of interest to the Dunn-Landry family including United Church of Christ and African American women. Of interest is a research paper by Rebecca T. Cureau, "Willis James at Leland College 1923-1928: A Documentation of a Young Folklorist in Louisiana."

Series VII: Newspaper Clippings (1911-2000, n.d.) boxes 17-18 are arranged in alphabetical order by person or subject divided into two groups of personal and general news clippings. Main topics covered are Leon Bates and family members Elise Cain, Henderson H. Dunn, Lillian Landry Dunn, Pierre Landry, and Lillian Dunn Perry. Articles for institutions include the Amistad Research Center, Gilbert Academy and Spelman College. General collected news clippings are in chronological order after the personal subject files.

Series VIII: Photographs (1886-1990, n.d.) boxes 19-21 are arranged into seven groups as follows personal; Central Congregational Church; colleges and universities; conferences; and general photographs of individuals, groups, and objects. Personal family photographs are arranged alphabetically then chronologically within the file units and can be found in boxes 19 & 20. Central Church photographs are housed at the beginning of box 21 with individuals listed in alphabetical order. The bulk of these photographs are undated. College and university, and conference photographs follow with Straight College Class of 1900 and Wiley College [ca 1904-1908] of particular interest. Individual photographs continue in this box in alphabetical order and a small amount of group photographs, which date [ca 1978]. The Dunn Family House on 2924 Louisiana Avenue is included though the photograph is undated. The number of photographs for each entry is noted in parenthesis at the end of each.

Series IX: Oversize Materials (1900-1999) is a combination of memorabilia, ledgers, photographs, certificates, plaques and scrapbooks. A scrapbook done between 1941-1945 contains materials from Gilbert Academy, while box 23 houses more photographs of Gilbert Academy and Wiley College faculty. A video oral history of Elise Dunn Cain and Eloise Dunn Warrick daughters of Henderson and Lillian B. Dunn, dating from 1996 can be found here. Certificates and diplomas attained by family members continue in box 25 with scrapbooks dating 1949, 1952 and 1955. Financial records for the B-Sharp Music Club 1925-1937 and minutes of meetings for the Colored Educational Alliance, Crescent City

Literary and Historical Club and the Times Picayune Christmas Gift Fund ledger books can be found in box 27.
