




AMISTAD ON THE GO!

Amistad on the Go! is an interactive print and digital educational program that works in partnership with teachers servicing students from 6th to 12th grade to provide comprehensive lessons on the history of African Americans in the United States. Amistad on the Go! Toolkits include detailed curricula, student activities, and access to online resources all of which focus on the study of primary sources in and outside of the classroom. The Amistad on the Go! program also includes thematic traveling exhibitions and in-service training for teachers.




























ETHIOPIAN THEATER is a theater of the black experience in America. It was started in June of 1973, and since that time has produced six original plays, and performed for several benefits, schools, and social and civic organizations.

The group was started by Monroe and Anthony Bean, along with a group of high school students, originally holding meetings in a lounge owned by the Bean brothers' mother. In August of 1973 the group presented its first production with the help of Dashiki Theater. From there it moved to operate temporarily out of Kingsley House, aftrewhich the group moved to its present home at Lapeyrouse and N. Johnson where it is now permanently based.

With a staff of five consisting of an artistic director, art director, business manager, secretary, and resident playwright, Ethiopian Theater continues to strive to bring the best of black theater to the New Orleans community through its productions, workshops, and consistent involvement in community activities.
